Although they apparently belong together, these are 3 separate girlie stock sets of 4 covers 20s front strike. The insides are marked with an A, B or C. In 2020, an article about these 12 covers was published within the Girlie Matchcover Collectors Club. It appears that these were only prototyped in a sample wheel and were never marketed. Only two girlie collectors have these sample wheel sets in their collection. Furthermore, there doesn't seem to be anyone who has one or more of these covers in their collection. Extremely rare!









Safety

Set with at least 10, but probably 11 or 12 (see Australia), Beehive skillets with safety suggestions. All fronts are the same. The cliché number C 6240 on the adhesive strip is typical for Swedish Match. The skillets are produced in New Zealand and the matches in Sweden.

Different sets of labels in 5 colors. I was able to find 3 images of sets, 2 of which are shown here. No doubt there are more. My Polish is not sufficient to provide further explanation.





Portugal

Safety

At least 4 different sets 40s covers in various colors with warnings for forest fires. No. 1 of each set is printed. The second strikers in my whole set FP3 have been cut off.



Set FP3 follows in its entirety. Set FP4 is identical. The sets FP1 and FP2 are identical to the first 12 copies of FP3. Note that numbers 13 to 24 look very different. These are about insects that live in the forest.





Set FP5 with 6 (?) 40s covers Policia de Seguranca Publica, in English: Public Security Police. Presumably these booklets were also released as boxes.

Switzerland

Switzerland is a 3-language country. The most common language is German, followed by French and Italian. Series match covers and labels from the manufacturers Terza and Etincelle are often released in these 3 languages. In Switzerland, each type of match cover has its own factory code. Sometimes on the outside on the top fold, but more often on the inside.
